
Medical Science Building (MSB) Renovation

• Scale:

- Renovating appx. 112,690 square feet (including appx. 57,000 sq ft of research lab space) of the seven-story, 258,000 sq ft MSB
- Scope includes space on floors 2, 4, 5 and 6

• Goal:

- Create modern, modular laboratory areas and collaborative environments
- Increase number of principal investigators in the building from 45 to 58 after renovation
- Budget:
 - \$51 million
- Timeline:
 - Anticipated completion by winter 2025/2026

NextGen – Building Out the Fourth Floor

• Scale:

- Build-out will add approximately 18,200 square feet of research laboratory space, including wet lab and office space
- Fourth floor will accommodate 15 investigators, bringing the total number of investigators in the building to approximately 60 wet lab researchers

• Goal:

- Create future home of NextGen neuroscience and reproductive biology researchers
- Budget:
 - \$16.5 million
- Timeline:
 - Anticipated completion by summer 2024



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Integration/Renovation Dominos

- Lottes, Pershing Hall renovation budgets approved by Curators June 23, 2022
 - OB-GYN Department offices relocating to Pershing Hall summer 2024 — \$10.86 million budget
 - Child Health Department relocating to Lottes Library summer 2024 — \$8.5 million budget
- Identifying temporary space for five medical school departments during renovations







Thompson Center Update

- Ribbon cutting on January 12 for newly renovated space in the current Thompson Center to open a therapy clinic and double space to see patients/families (pictured)
- New building plans for the new Thompson Center will be presented to the Board of Curators for approval on February 9
- New facility will be a state-of-the-art facility that brings together research, education/training and clinical care

2nd Quarter of FY23 (Oct-Dec)

- Better Quarter for MUHC in working our way back to FY21 financial performance
 - Demonstrated ability to move bottom line from \$4M/month into \$5M-\$6M/month range
 - Avoided surgical volume/vacation conflict issues seen in July
 - Overcame a snow day of cancelled clinic visits in Dec
 - Team focus on collections produces strong results

Carrying Q2 Results into Q3 & Q4 nets MUHC @ ~\$45M Operating Margin

* FRA (Medicaid Tax), Purchased Services, Legal/Compliance, Depreciation, Amortization, etc.

 "Triple-demic" drove December agency staffing to all-time high: 329 FTE/ @ \$115/hr. \$6.6M of Agency.

Revenues up in tandem.

- Previous high was May 2022 with \$6.5M/ 250 FTE/ @ \$149/hr.
- Kaufman Hall preliminary 2022:
 - Not-For-Profit Industry Margins down from 2% pre-pandemic to -0.2% in 2022
 - More than half of hospitals at negative margin
- Working with Kaufman Hall on Public Academic Medical Center peer group for fuller 2022 comparison at next meeting



Five Year Financial Planning Process

- Five year financial process concluding with UM System Finance Team
 - Demonstrates a return of margin and cash dependent on Growth, Revenue Enhancement, Operating Efficiency & Capital Expense Management
 - Outer years are aggressive and will be reviewed as part of annual update of 5-year plan. FY23/24 targets are achievable and exceedable
 - Will require tight collaboration with School of Medicine Clinical Chairs & Faculty leaders will be engaged as part of FY24 budget process






Student Enrollment

Applications vs Accepted (includes fall & spring semesters)












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
Sponsored Expenditures by Category




