Fiscal Year 2019 Tuition and Required Fees
UM

At the April board meeting, preliminary FY 2019 tuition and fee recommendations were presented as an information item. This page provides a summary of FY 2019 recommendations, which are being presented for approval at the May 21, 2018 Board meeting. Details of the recommendations are provided on the following pages.

- Undergraduate and graduate resident and nonresident tuition rates are recommended to increase by CPI of 2.1%.
- The increase for undergraduate resident students for Fall 2018 and spring and summer 2019 terms will be waived to an effective rate of 1% increase as long as state funding received in FY 2019 is at the FY 2018 core of \$395.8 million.

- S&T is requesting new tuition rates for international students that are \$75 above the non-resident rates.
- Professional school tuition rates are proposed to increase from 1.2% to 6% depending on the program.
- MU Occupational Therapy (MOT) is being converted from a graduate program to a professional. A new professional tuition rate is proposed to be used for recruiting the Fall 2019 class.
- Required fees are proposed to increase at the rate of inflation of 2.1% for UMKC and S&T. MU's total required fee rate will increase by 1.9%.
- Under the Higher Education Student Funding Act (HESFA, SB389), the highest increase permissible for UM for combined tuition and required fees without seeking a waiver for FY 2019 is 2.1% or \$201.93.
- Current tuition and required fee proposals are in compliance with the HESFA. No waiver is required.

Recommended Action - Fiscal Year 2019 Tuition and Required Fees, UM

It was recommended by the respective Chancellors, endorsed by President Choi, recommended by the Finance Committee, moved by Curator _____ and seconded by Curator _____, that the attached schedules of rates for tuition, information technology fees, and student activity, facility and service fees, be approved, effective with the 2018 fall term.

1. Tuition and information technology fees as shown in the attached schedules and described in the Board materials be approved and become effective beginning with the 2018 fall term. Specifically this includes:
 - a. Tuition rates to increase as follows:
 - i. Resident undergraduate tuition to increase by CPI of 2.1%. For fall 2018 and spring and summer 2019 terms, resident undergraduate students will be assessed the increased rate of 2.1%. The President is directed to use his authority under CRR 230.010.C to waive tuition so that resident undergraduate students pay an increased rate of 1% provided that the President may withdraw such waiver and require payment at the increased rate of 2.1% in the event state funding received in FY 2019 is not at the FY 2018 core of \$395.8 million. In future fiscal years, the full 2.1% increase may be assessed without any waiver or other discount.
 - ii. Nonresident and UMSL Illinois undergraduate tuition to increase by 2.1%.
 - iii. Resident and nonresident graduate tuition to increase by 2.1%.
 - iv. Metropolitan undergraduate and graduate tuition to increase by 2.1%.
 - v. Professional school tuition to increase from 1.2% to 6%.
 - vi. S&T will add a new undergraduate and graduate tuition rates for international students that are \$75 above the non-resident rates.
 - b. Information Technology fee will increase by CPI (2.1%).
 - c. UMKC Graduate Nursing tuition to increase by \$50 per credit hour for fall 2018 and increase an additional \$50 for fall 2019.
 - d. MU Occupational Therapy (MOT) is being converted from a graduate program to a professional program over the next year. A new

professional tuition rate of \$550 per credit hour for resident and \$1,107 per credit hour for non-resident students will be assessed for the Fall 2019 class.

2. Student activity, facility and service fees as shown in the attached schedule and described in the Board materials be approved and become effective beginning with the 2018 fall term.
3. Effective beginning with the 2018 fall term, the Board of Curators revokes and repeals all previous tuition and required fee schedules and adopts the attached tuition and required fees rate schedules. The Board finds such action to be necessary for the maintenance and operation of the University.

Tuition Rate Recommendations

Tuition rates increase proposals were presented at the April 12, 2018 Board of Curators meeting as an information item. Detailed rate schedules are attached at the end of this document for approval at the May special Board meeting. The rates included in the detail schedules are the same as proposed at the April meeting.

Higher Education Student Funding Act (HESFA) Tuition and Required Fees

Undergraduate tuition and required fees charged to all Missouri resident students are governed by the Higher Education Student Funding Act (HESFA, Section 173.1003, RSMo, commonly referred to as SB389.) Tuition and required fees typically includes base tuition, information technology fee, and student activity, facility and services fees. In FY14 UMSL restructured their tuition rates to include base tuition and all required fees, and thus eliminated separate billing for other required fees. The Higher Education Student Funding Act modifies the definition of tuition and required fees to exclude fees that were passed by student referendum or officially recognized student government organizations popularly elected by the students on campus.

The table below shows tuition and required fees for a Missouri resident undergraduate student as defined by the Higher Education Student Funding Act (SB389.) The FY 2019 rates are recommended to increase up to CPI of 2.1%. The highest increase permissible for UM for combined tuition and required fees without seeking a waiver for FY 2019 is 2.1% or \$201.93.

At the April board meeting, preliminary FY 2019 Supplemental and Other Related Enrollment Fee recommendations were presented as an information item. Final recommendations are being presented for approval at the May 21, 2018 board meeting and will be effective with the Fall 2018 term.

Schedules of recommended supplemental fee rates by campus for FY 2019 are located at the end of this document. The changes fall into four broad categories:

- Increases in supplemental fees previously discussed with the Board that were to be phased in over multiple years.
- Small increases in supplemental fees to fund ongoing program costs. The majority of the supplemental fee increases fall into this group and will increase in the range between CPI of 2.1% and 5%. Some supplemental fee rates will not increase.
- Increases in high cost programs driven by program needs. The high cost programs affected are primarily business, engineering, and nursing. Increases in this category vary and are not anticipated to impact program demand.
- New and restructured supplemental fees. MU is requesting a new Business undergraduate excellence fee. MU is requesting to restructure Education undergraduate and graduate course fees and Engineering course fees.

eLearning, special program delivery, and continuing education instructional fees will remain flat or increase at the same rate as the tuition rates they are linked to.

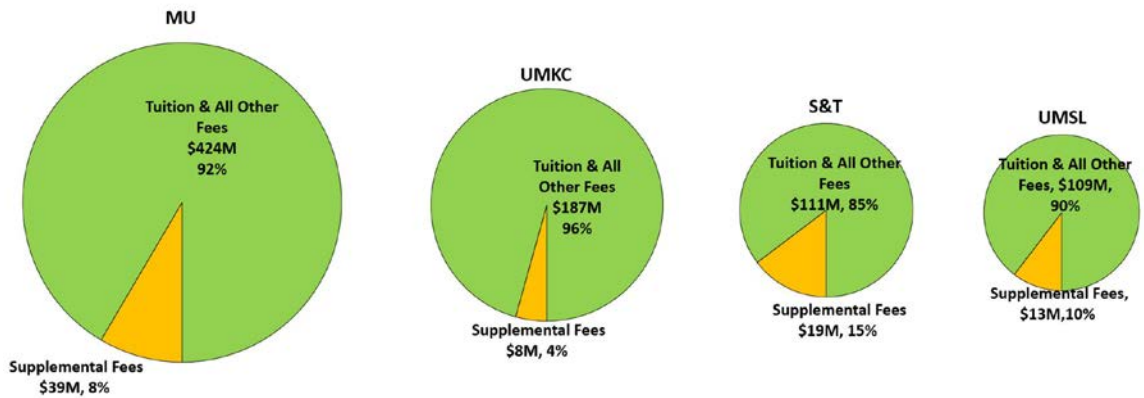

Supplemental course fees are assessed for enrollment in specific courses and are not subject to the Higher Education Student Funding Act (HESFA, Section 173.1003, RSMo, commonly referred to as SB389.) Supplemental fees represent about 9% of tuition and fees for the university. The following charts show the percentages for each of the four campuses. While they are not a significant part of the total tuition and fees budget, they can be critically important in meeting strategic needs of particular schools, colleges and programs. These recommendations are based on the specific needs of programs, cost of program delivery, relative price in the market for comparable programs, and student demand.



Supplemental academic fees are commonly used in major institutions similar to the University of Missouri campuses and in surrounding states. These fees are typically termed program fees and assessed to all students in the program, typically on a flat fee per semester basis, or academic course fees and assessed for enrollment in a particular course either on a course or credit hour basis.

Following are the recommended schedules for supplemental course fees and other related enrollment fees. The fee rates are recommended to become effective beginning with the fall 2018 term. Details on the supplemental fee recommendations were provided at the April 12, 2018 Board meeting and the recommendations have not changed.

Summary

Missouri University of Science and Technology Intent to Change MDHE Admission Selectivity Category

Missouri University of Science and Technology wishes to change its admissions selectivity category from “selective” to “highly selective” applicable for the Fall 2019 entering class. The change is requested for the following reasons:

- 1) Currently, Missouri University of Science and Technology enrolls the second highest academic quality freshman class in Missouri, second only to Washington University, based on average ACT or SAT scores and class rank/high school GPA.
- 2) Among students who report their ACT scores to colleges/universities in Missouri, those who report to Missouri S&T have achieved the second highest level of ACT’s measures of college readiness, behind only Washington University, and ahead of Truman State University, the only public university currently set at the “highly selective” level (see attachment 2).
- 3) The selectivity category of “selective” underrepresents the academic background required to succeed at Missouri University of Science and Technology.
- 4) Setting the selectivity category to “highly selective” represents current admissions practices, and will help students understand what the typical requirement to enter Missouri University of Science and Technology currently is. Our Common Data Set data show that our incoming freshmen already meet this standard (see attachment 1).

This request has been vetted through Missouri University of Science and Technology Provost Robert J. Marley, Interim Chancellor Dr. Christopher G. Maples, and approved by General Counsel.

Background: Missouri S&T Request to MDHE for Highly Selective Status

MDHE defines selectivity differently than national ranking organizations such as *U.S. News & World Report*. Outside of MDHE, selectivity is defined most often as percentage of admissions (e.g., the lower the percentage of admitted students that apply, the more selective the university is thought to be). MDHE uses numerical criteria, which are more comparable across universities than the subjective criterion of admission percentage.

MDHE's criteria for Highly Selective institutions require are for first-time, full-time degree-seeking students and transfer students who have attained a combined percentile score (from adding their high school percentile rank and the percentile rank attained on the ACT or SAT) that is greater than or equal to 140 points. There are two key components for highly selective institutions:

- Students who achieve a score of 27 or better on the ACT or an equivalent score on the SAT are automatically admitted to highly selective institutions.
- No more than 10% of the first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshman class will have a combined percentile score of 139 or less.

According to the Coordinating Board for Higher Education, Missouri's highly selective institution is Truman State University.

Selective institutions, including Missouri S&T and its sister University of Missouri System campuses, admit first-time, full-time degree-seeking students and transfer students who have:

- Attained a combined percentile score (from adding their high school percentile rank and the percentile rank attained on the ACT or SAT) that is greater than or equal to 120 points.
- Students who achieve a score of 24 or better on the ACT or an equivalent score on the SAT are automatically admitted to selective institutions.
- No more than 10% of the first-time, full time degree-seeking freshman class will have a combined percentile score of 119 or less.

Outside of the UM System, Missouri State University is the only other public institution classified as Selective,

Ranking of the highest ACT 75th percentile scores provides a good comparison of universities in Missouri, as well as universities outside of Missouri with which Missouri S&T competes for, primarily, engineering students. The maximum possible ACT score is 36 (the percentile rank changes slightly from year to year, depending on the overall test difficulty and performance of the tested population of students). Rankings and data on the next page are for 2015.
